performing arts companies prevents artists in these fields from working professionally and realising some of the advances in their art. Thirdly, a limited knowledge of Ukrainian Canadian art has resulted in a lack of appreciation of the artistic value of the works of these artists and has served to isolate Ukrainian Canadian art from the rest of the Canadian artistic community.

It is important, therefore, that support be given to the creation of the Alberta Council for the Ukrainian Arts which will assist and facilitate in the development and management of Ukrainian arts in Alberta. The Council should undertake the following tasks:

- 1) to act as a resource centre, centralising data about Ukrainian arts organizations throughout Canada generally and Alberta specifically, providing information about the different sectors, statistics and funding information;
- 2) to inform, coordinate and enhance communication amongst groups regarding funding concerts and promotion;
- 3) to assist in the organizing of workshops, research and training;
- 4) promote individual artists of Ukrainian origin; and,
- 5) organize major Ukrainian cultural events and/or to provide a coordinated program for existing annual events.

A PROPOSAL FOR THE ALBERTA COUNCIL FOR THE UKRAINIAN ARTS

A great deal of interesting artistic activity is taking place in the Ukrainian Canadian arts in Alberta.

There are over eighty dance groups, many of which are developing in new and innovative directions, thus changing and adapting Ukrainian dance to a contemporary cultural expression.

Some fifteen choirs and countless singers and musicians are elaborating Ukrainian religious and secular music.

More than two hundred crafts people are working in the applied arts in fields such as weaving, embroidery, woodworking and Ukrainian musical instrument production.

Excellent works are being produced by individual visual artists, filmmakers, writers and poets of Ukrainian descent in their respective fields.

All of these artists, however, face a number of common problems, which act as an impediment not only on their personal artistic development, but also on the growth of Ukrainian Canadian art. First of all the lack of a common forum and opportunities for artistic interchange means that the artists tend to work in isolation from each other and are often unaware of others in their own field in other centres in Alberta and of current developments in their fields. Secondly, the absence of professional Ukrainian
