**THE WALTER SURMA TARNOPOLSKY ENDOWMENT FOR THE STUDY AND PROMOTION OF HUMAN RIGHTS**

The Endowment has been established by the Chair of Ukrainian Studies Foundation in memory of the Honourable Mr. Justice Walter Surma Tarnopolsky, Justice for the Court of Appeal for Ontario. He died on September 15, 1993, shortly after returning from his most recent assignment as advisor to the Government of South Africa. He received his education at the University of Saskatchewan, Columbia University (U.S.A.) and the London School of Economics (U.K.). He taught at the University of Saskatchewan, University of Windsor, Osgoode Hall Law School at York University and the University of Ottawa. He was a member of the United Nations Human Rights Committee.

Walter Surma Tarnopolsky was an internationally respected human rights scholar and advocate, and an important contributor to the drafting of the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms in 1982.

The Endowment is being created to honour an outstanding Canadian, the son of Ukrainian Pioneers, Hryhoriy and Maria Tarnopolsky.

This annual award will be made by a selection committee to a scholar, author or student for academic merit in the research or promotion of human rights. The amount of the award will be dependent on the amount of endowment secured from the public at large.

The WALTER SURMA TARNOPOLSKY ENDOWMENT FOR THE STUDY AND PROMOTION OF HUMAN RIGHTS is being established with the support of Mr. Justice Tarnopolsky's widow, Dr. Joanna Kramer and the Tarnopolsky family. Individuals as well as organizations are asked to be generous in assisting the creation of this most worthwhile memorial to a man of compassion, courage and dedication to human rights. The World Congress of Ukrainian Lawyers is the first organization to endorse the creation of the Endowment.
