


UKRAINIAN SHUMKA DANCERS

Their deportment and standard of performance has brought great credit to our city.

The Ukrainian community is justifiably proud of their achievements of the past eight years and hopes the Shumka Dancers will continue to provide the youth of Edmonton with the further opportunity to excel in the preservation and perpetuation of the most vibrant and colorful element of Ukrainian culture — the inimitable folk dances.

ROMAN SOLTYKEWYCH




Conductor, Centennial Youth Choirs

Roman Soltykewych received his training in conducting church and secular choirs in Western Ukraine, notably at the Lysenko Institute of Music in Lviv. His sincere dedication to the art of choral singing has never abated; he is tireless in his efforts to elevate the standards of choral singing and to stimulate interest in its participation.

Before coming to Canada in 1951, he conducted choirs in Western Ukraine, university students' choirs in Krakow, and various choirs in Austria and France. For two years after his arrival in Edmonton, he was choir director at St. Josaphats Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral. Since

1953 he has been the conductor of the Dnipro Ukrainian Male Chorus of Edmonton. For the past two years Mr. Soltykewych has been the choirmaster at St. John's Ukrainian Orthodox Cathedral of Edmonton, where he has also trained the Senior and Junior "CYMK" Youth Choirs, the former of which was honored last July 16th by an invitation to sing the entire church service in St. Vladimir's Ukrainian Orthodox Cathedral in Toronto.



CHESTER KUC

Director, Ukrainian Shumka Dancers

Chester Kuc began his training in Ukrainian dancing under the renowned balletmaster, Vasile Avramenko, who brought this traditional folk-art to the North American continent. Mr. Kuc maintained an intense interest in folk-dancing and constantly strove to organize a representative group of young people dedicated to its development on a near-professional plan. His aspirations were fulfilled in 1959 when he founded the Ukrainian Shumka Dancers. Under his capable direction, the ensemble has flourished beyond all expectations until in eight years it is recognized as one

of the outstanding groups of its kind in Canada.

Since 1956, Mr. Kuc has conducted classes of instruction in Ukrainian dancing in the various parishes throughout the city. These well-planned classes were instrumental in preparing hundreds of young people from among whose number Mr. Kuc was able to select the most proficient students to form the nucleus of the SHUMKA DANCERS and to ensure the ensemble's continuing success.
